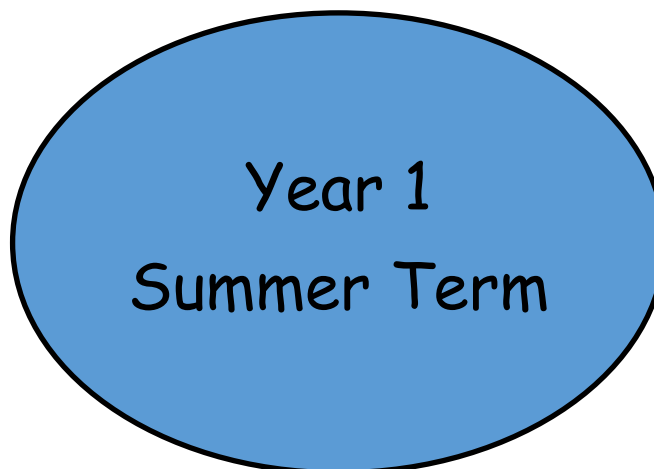
RRSA Article 29: Your education should help you use and develop your talents and abilities
