


Stone Age to Iron Age

<p>Mild</p> 	<p>Write a list of at least 5 questions that you would like to ask a Stone Age person.</p> 	<p>Draw a Venn diagram to sort similarities and differences between life in the Stone Age and life today.</p> <p>Global Goal 2</p>	<p>Draw a Stone Age feast, thinking carefully about the food and drink that would be on offer. Design a piece of cave art using materials of your choice. i.e. paint, chalk, crayon.</p>
<p>Hot</p> 	<p>Make up a quiz with facts about The Stone Age. Make sure you also have the answers!</p> 	<p>In the Paleolithic period, a counting system using tallying began to be used. Using this system, make up some calculations for a friend to solve. RRSA Article 30</p> 	<p>Draw and label a Stone Age person. Can you add any similarities and differences compared to us?</p> 	<p>Forces can be pushes, pulls or twists or a combination of these. Complete a table to show as many different types of forces that you can think of.</p>	<p>Design and make an ancient stone circle or a replica of Stonehenge. Be creative in the way you make your stone circle. Global Goal 15</p> 
<p>Spicy</p> 	<p>Create a leaflet for 'How to survive the Stone Age.' Imagine you are transported back to the Stone Age and need a guide to help you survive. What would the guide say? What tips would it have? Use ICT, if you wish.</p> <p>Global Goal 3</p>	<p>Make a timeline of events and changes from this period. Use your knowledge of ordering numbers to make sure the events are accurately placed on the timeline.</p>	<p>Find out about Stone Age animals and make an alphabetical list.</p> 	<p>Write a biography for Isaac Newton. What are the pros and cons of friction? Describe what would happen if gravity did not exist.</p> 	<p>Stone Age people build shelters to live in using materials they had gathered. Gather some natural materials and build a model shelter.</p> <p>RRSA Article 27</p>
