Year 1 Curriculum News

Dear Parents/Carers

We thought you may be interested to learn about some of the varied and interesting work planned for the Spring term in Year 1.

Literacy - The main strands of fiction study this term are 'stories with familiar settings', 'fairy tales' and 'nursery rhymes'. Non-fiction areas will include writing a letter and creating information texts about Dinosaurs. We will also be including specific work on vocabulary, grammar and spelling, as well as our daily 'Letters and Sounds' sessions.

Numeracy - The main areas of study are 'Addition and Subtraction within 20', 'Numbers to 50', 'Length and Height' and 'Weight and Volume'.

Science - The areas studied this term will include Everyday Materials and Seasons.


ICT - Y1 children will be learning about the different parts of a computer, and what they are used for, as well as learning about how iPads can be used to support their work in Maths.

Cross Curricular Themed Topic- The theme for this term is 'Panic on Pudding Lane'. We will be looking at world maps, atlases and globes to identify the UK and its countries as well as other countries, continents and oceans. We will be looking at the events of the Great Fire of London, and how life has changed since the events occurred.

Music - The children will gain knowledge in musical composition, playing instruments such as the recorder and the glockenspiel, as well as enjoying singing together.

RE - We will be covering 2 units of work this term, the first being 'Belonging to a Sikh family' and in the second half term we will look at 'What Christians Remember at Easter'.

PE - This term the children will be developing their dance skills, as well as their skills in hitting, running and catching. Please ensure your child has the **correct** PE kit in school **ALL** week.



PSHE - This will be taught through a variety of games, circle times and discussions. We will be continuing our work on E-Safety and Anti-bullying and this term we will also have Fairtrade Fortnight. We will be continuing our work on The Great Dream as well as embedding our RRSA work into everything we do.
