Absence Request – Notes to Parents/Carers

As mentioned on the Absence Request form overleaf, the law states that Headteachers cannot authorise term time holidays unless there are exceptional circumstances.

If the holiday is unauthorised, you may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice fine. This is £60 per parent per child and rises to £120 per parent per child if not paid after 21 days. This amount must be paid within 28 Days.

School cannot grant a leave of absence retrospectively. If you allow your child to miss school in term time for an avoidable reason without obtaining prior approval from school, you may be issued with a Penalty Notice

Parents and Carers, by law, are responsible to ensure their children receive an efficient full time education.
